Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.



Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish.



In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.

However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

- Do you sacrifice your time, energy and personal goals in order to invest in your marriage?
- Do you consider the emotional desires of your wife as more important than your sexual desires?
- Do you lay down your pride and be the first one to say you are sorry and ask for forgiveness?

If we are failing in our marriage and relationships with others we don't have a marriage and relationship problem, we have a worship problem.
