Luke 19:28

*After Jesus had said this, he
went on ahead, going up to
Jerusalem.*



Luke 18:31-34

Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, “We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. He will be delivered over to the Gentiles.



Luke 18:31-34

*They will mock him, insult him and spit on him; they will flog him and kill him. On the third day he will rise again.” The disciples **did not understand** any of this. Its meaning was hidden from them, and they **did not know** what he was talking about.*



Luke 19:29-34

As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, “Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden.



Luke 19:29-34

Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, ‘Why are you untying it?’ say, ‘The Lord needs it.’” Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them.



Luke 19:29-34

As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, “Why are you untying the colt?” They replied, “The Lord needs it.” They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it.







Zechariah 9:9-10

*Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion!
Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See,

a donkey**, on a colt, the foal of a

Luke 19:36-38

*As he went along, people spread
their cloaks on the road.*



When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: “Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!” “Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!”



Luke 19:39-40

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, “Teacher, rebuke your disciples!” “I tell you,” he replied, “if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out.”



Luke 19:41-44

*As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it and said, “If you, even you, had only known on this day what would **bring you peace** —but now it is hidden from your eyes.*
