God's Great Plan of Salvation - Summary

What we've learned so far.

- God is one God expressed in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God created the universe & everything in it. He is eternal and perfect (without sin). Isaiah 40:28b The Lord is the everlasting God, the creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.
- When we disobey God, it is sin. Sin separates us from God because God cannot dwell with sin. Every human is a sinner. Only Jesus never sinned. God made a plan for Jesus to die on the cross to wash away our sin. Romans 3:23 For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- God takes sin very seriously. In the Old Testament times, God's people had to sacrifice animals to receive forgiveness. At the "first" Passover God's rule was that a lamb must be sacrificed and the blood put on the door frame so that the angel of death would "passover" the house. The blood of the lamb did not, in and of itself, save their lives but the people's obedience to God's command did. This also foreshadowed what Jesus would do on the cross. Hebrews 9:22 The law requires that nearly everything be cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.
- Jesus died in our place and became the ultimate sacrifice. He died ONCE and for ALL. Romans 5:8 God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 2 Corinthians 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
- Our responsibility and response to God's plan of salvation is to HEAR, BELIEVE, CONFESS, REPENT, and BE BAPTIZED. James 1:22 Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves Do what it says.
- Baptism is a symbol of Christ cleansing us from sin. It is also a picture of his death, burial, and resurrection. Once we've trusted in Christ for salvation, we should be baptized. Mark 16:15-16 Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.
- Once we HEAR, BELIEVE, CONFESS, REPENT, and BE BAPTIZED, that is only the beginning of our walk with Christ. God gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit. We should spend time with God through prayer, attending church, reading our Bible, having our own Bible devotions, worship, and surrounding ourselves with Godly things. We can participate in the Lord's Supper and tithing and should serve God in some way. 2 Corinthians 5:17 If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!
