2. One family with disabled caregiver within the city limits of Wilmington, (*Lancaster Ave on the west side of I 95*) is in need of **major house cleaning**, focus on the kitchen. Kitchen needs to be cleaned, organized, remove damaged hutch cabinet and add new furniture (IKEA unit, table etc.) as time allows.
  - *Friday 6-8pm*, clean home, remove damaged hutch and trash,– 1 volunteer with a truck and another to assist with removal, 2-4 cleaners
  - *Saturday 9am-done*, finish cleaning and assemble and place new furniture – 2-4 volunteer

For more than 35 years, FH has aimed to fill gaps in Delaware and support those experiencing homelessness, houselessness, and both. Regardless of one's story or how one comes to FH, we believe everyone deserves a place to call home. Ensuring love and support are at the heart of all we do, we address houselessness and homelessness through our programs such as the Clothing Bank, Empowerment Centers, Winter Programming, Financial Assistance, and Transitional Housing. For this opportunity, volunteers will be at our Clothing Bank where they will be assisting with sorting through clothing donations. This means determining if the clothing is usable and then sorting or folding the clothing.

### What project do they have for us to do?

What Project do they have for us to do?

- SBM has four different type projects with different skillsets. Some projects take all week, or are offered to serve all week, or take place on specific days/times of the week.
  1. SBM has opportunities to prepare/serve/clean-up meals served during lunch every day from 11am-1pm for 2-4 people.
  2. Two nights (Monday & Saturday) SBM has opportunities to prepare/serve/clean-up dinner from 5-7pm for 2-4 people.
  3. Wednesday of GO Week, SBM will have a small church service for the men and women groups in their chapel.
