

More than a Building, Brick By Brick, Ephesians 4:11-16, 2:19-22, 8/17/25

Our kids growing up loved Legos, every Christmas, every birthday it was legos. One year we visited Legoland at King of Prussia Mall- [lego display, picture](#). The people who do these are called Lego Masterbuilders. Masterbuilders have built some mindblowing things with legos. This guy in Philly built a replica of the [USS Missouri](#) in his shed. The largest was a full-scale replica of a [Star Wars X-Wing fighter](#). It took 32 master builders, over five million LEGO bricks, and more than 17,000 hours to put together and it was displayed in the middle of Times Square a few years ago. But my favorite? The [James May Lego House](#) an actual functioning house- Built in a Vineyard in Surrey, England, the life-size lego house uses over three million bricks and features a staircase, toilet and shower. May has set a new world record: becoming the first man to live in a fully functioning house made of Legos...he lived in it for a couple of days.

It's amazing what a masterbuilder can build with enough bricks. Here's my question for you today: Take your lego brick in your hand, what could our Masterbuilder Jesus build with each of us here at Brandywine? Just like these masterbuilders had a vision and built something amazing, in eternity past, God had a vision of something extraordinary- the church. And 2000 years ago, the Messiah Jesus came to begin building that vision. [Matthew 16:18 Jesus said, I will build my church, and the gates of Hell will not overcome it](#). Even through intense persecution at times throughout history and attempts to undermine or discredit Christianity, the church prevails. The great empire of Rome is gone, you can visit the rubble, huge companies and movements have come and gone, but Jesus' church continues growing and moving throughout the world. When Jesus spoke about the church, of course Jesus was not talking about bricks and mortar, and steeples. He's talking about people. There are lots of big beautiful church buildings that are empty of people. What makes the church are people who have given their lives to Jesus and are following him together in a location. That's the unstoppable force Jesus is talking about that started in Jerusalem and moves to the ends of the world, and is right here in the Brandywine Valley today. Jesus promised he would do it 2000 years ago. Brick by brick. And here we are. 55 years ago, Brandywine Valley Church was built brick by brick with a group of people who had the vision of loving God and reaching their community for Jesus together. And each of us today, have a role to play in that.

That's what this series is all about. [More than a Building](#). While we are beginning a significant renovation in January on our building to better facilitate the vision and ministry of our church, over the next 8 weeks we are going to see Jesus' vision for the church and for each of us as part of his church.

Ephesians 2:19-21 *Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.*

Message version...

Ephesians 2:19-20 God is building a [stain glass cathedral? No!] a home.

He's using [only the ultra-talented? No!] us all—irrespective of how we got here—in what he is building. Maybe you say, I didn't grow up in church. I'm not sure I fit here... It's new to me, or I'm new to Brandywine, I got here two weeks ago... irrespective of how you got here! God wants to use you.

He used the apostles and prophets for the foundation. While Brandywine might be relatively modern, while some of the music we sing and how we dress and our technology might be modern, God's church isn't built on modern thinking. Not on trendy ideas or going along with the culture. The foundation was built 2000 years ago on apostles who walked with Jesus and were taught by Jesus and carried his message- like Peter and James and John and Paul and prophets and pastors and evangelists who came after them like Mark, and Barnabas, and Lydia, and Priscilla and Aquilla. So the church is dynamic and ever-changing, but it's also historic and built on timeless truth that doesn't shift with the winds of culture. Now he's using you, fitting you in brick by brick, stone by stone,

with Christ Jesus as the cornerstone that holds all the parts together. In ancient construction, the cornerstone was the first and most important stone laid. Here's a picture of the cornerstone of Herod's Temple, the very same one in Jesus' day that he may have had in mind when he called himself the cornerstone. The cornerstone determines the alignment and stability of the entire building. If the cornerstone is off, the whole structure would be crooked. It also often bore the weight of two intersecting walls. Paul says, this is Jesus! As Christians, we believe the Bible when it says that Jesus is God in the flesh who came and showed us a new way to be human- living with humility, love and truth. Who ultimately came to give his life as a spiritual ransom. To pay our debt of sin and rise with power from the grave so that we can be forgiven eternally and be with God forever. And if you haven't trusted Jesus as your Savior, you can do that today. We would love to help you learn how to do that, come down front after the service.

But Jesus wasn't done. He sent us on that same mission to demonstrate and declare the gospel to everyone. Paul says Now he's using you, fitting you in brick by brick, stone by stone, That's what the church is all about. He's now building each of us, brick by brick... You are not here by accident. Not a coincidence, you are here today, and you are here on this earth for divine purpose, but never as a Rambo Christian, or an Elsa Christian... an isolated Christian... doing your own thing, disconnected. To be a Christian is to be part of Christ's church. Many people say, I go to Brandywine. I like the music, kids program, students, the preacher doesn't put me to sleep... you go to Brandywine, but are you part of Brandywine? There is a big difference between the two. Between spectator and participant. And the key difference is what are you doing with your brick?

On February 13, 1997, the container ship *Tokio Express* was struck by a rogue wave about 20 miles off Land's End in Cornwall, England. The violent upheaval caused 62 containers to fall overboard—one of which held 5 million Lego pieces, many of which sank and were buried on

the bottom of the ocean floor. Some 20 years later people began spotting them **washing on shore**. So if you want free legos, head over to England.

But here's the point. **Don't bury your brick!!** Maybe you've been hesitant to get involved, or just put it off, or you've had other priorities, or maybe you used to but you burnt out, or too old and you feel like a washed up lego piece...he can still use you and we need you!

Miss Winnie was in her 90s...after decades of serving in our children's ministry, she was still serving the Lord, using her brick. One Sunday morning in walks a guy named Chip, he had a rough past, spent time in prison, an addict, but he was invited to come to church...he was so nervous to go to church that morning that he drank just to get himself in the door. So in walks this guy with tattoos everywhere, smelling like alcohol, and as soon as he walked in the doors he immediately regretted it. He thought, I don't belong here. And he was considering turning right back and going home. But little old Miss Winnie spotted him and came right up to him and gave him a big hug, looked him in the eyes and said with love, "We are so glad you came this morning, you belong here!" And in that moment Chip melted, and felt at home. That was 10 years ago, and Chip...Tim SantaBarbara came to Christ, had his life transformed and is using his brick to change lives and disciple men in our church and around the Brandywine Valley through his ministry in prison and in Broken Beginnings. Now... Imagine if Miss Winnie buried her brick.

If you bring your brick, God will build his house and use this house to reach our community and beyond. But if you bury your brick, there will be pieces missing...the rest of us miss out, the community misses out, because you are needed.

Hold your brick in your hand and look at it. Different colors, shapes, and sizes, each representing the diversity of gifts and talents and experiences and passions and abilities in this room that God wants to use. While there is some variety in these bricks, in the Church it's infinitely more. Did you know that every heartbeat is unique? No two heartbeats are the same, and that's true with us. All of us are unique and God designed us that way.

Jesus wants to use you, don't let limitations or disabilities stop you from playing your part! One of our rockstar greeters is a young adult with special needs- Caroline Cordrey. There are virtually endless ways you can use your brick to build Jesus' church. I want to challenge every one of us this morning who calls Brandywine their church home- to use their brick. So let me share with you some of the most red zone, critical needs right now in the church. In just a few weeks on September 7th we are moving to three services. Do you know that it takes about 150 people per Sunday to do what we do? And we need to add to that number for our 3rd service. So now is the time to use your brick.

Connections Team

Our connections team is far more than holding doors on Sundays. They help create a warm, welcoming, loving atmosphere that says, "You belong here!" They represent the very hands and feet of Jesus as they pour coffee, hold doors, help you with your coat, help you find a seat when you are running a little late. Help our guests find their way around our complex building.
